☐ MOTHER/BABY EXERCISE Periodically, the JCC offers an exercise class for mothers/caregivers and their babies (6 wks-6 mo.). These classes are fun for moms and babies love them too. Babies are held during the work out or can be on a mat or in a pumpkin seat. These groups often spin into playgroups.
☐ PARENT EDUCATION Wide varieties of parenting classes/workshop/speakerss are offered through the JCC and are featured in our department brochure.
□ PLAYGROUPS The JCC coordinates a large network of playgroups by organizing groups of 8 or so families, with babies close in age, who live near each other. These groups meet on a regular basis, usually rotating in members' homes, and become fairly autonomous. Often very strong friendships are formed and these groups become like extended family.
☐ JEWISH FAMILY EDUCATION This can take several forms, from a holiday "make & take" workshop to "Our Jewish Home". OJH is modeled after Parents as Teachers with a Parent Educator making personal visits to enrolled families and is geared toward families with children ages 3 and up. There is also J-PAT (Jewish Parents as Teachers) which is geared towards children under 3 years of age.
☐ FAMILY SPECIAL EVENTS There are numerous special events offered for young families. These include Tour de Fun, family concerts, holiday programs and Shabbat picnics to name a few.
☐ SHALOM ST. LOUIS Opportunities to help newcomers feel connected to the St. Louis Jewish community are offered through the JCC. We are also happy to help introduce families one on one.
□ VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES Numerous volunteer opportunities are available through the Family Centers at the J (Mom's Action Committee), the Jewish Federation and throughout the entire Jewish community. Whether now or down the road, volunteering is a great way to meet other young parents and to contribute as little or as much time as you wish.
☐ CHILDCARE/PRESCHOOL See the Shalom Baby website (shalombabystl.org) for a listing of childcare/preschool facilities.
☐ WOMEN'S CONNECTION Offers women an opportunity to address local, national, and overseas needs of the Jewish community through the Jewish Federation. It is a place for women to identify Jewishly and interact socially with other women, while becoming involved through education, fundraising, and leadership development.
☐ YOUNG PROFESSIONAL DIVISION (YPD) YPD, a committee of the Jewish Federation, is a link to the Jewish community for young men and women in their 20's and 30's as well as an opportunity for them to get involved in direct service projects, social programs, leadership opportunities, educational programming, etc.
☐ CONCIERGE FOR YOUNG FAMILIES The concierge provides information on Jewish resources in the St. Louis region tailored to specific needs

of families with young children.
