

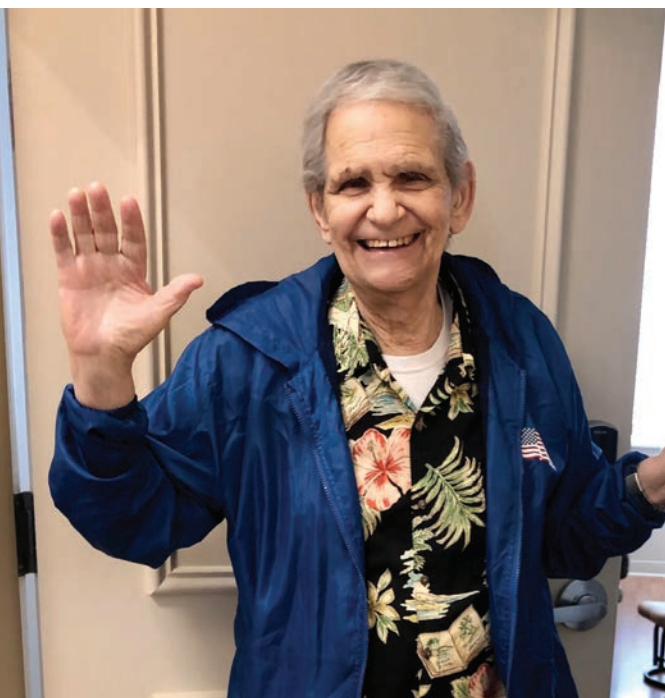

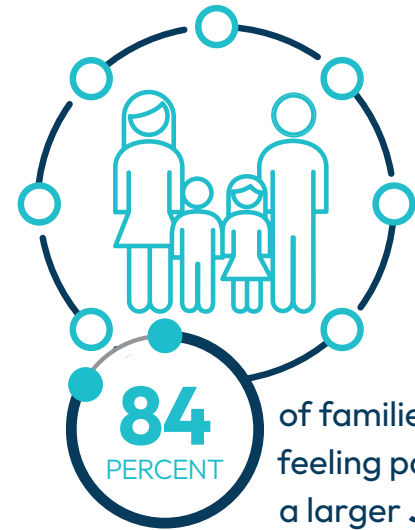

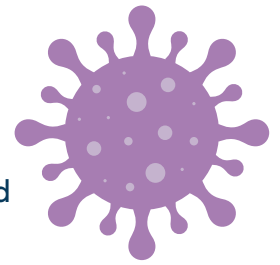
The Federation Community Security program covers the St. Louis Metropolitan area as well as Jefferson City, Columbia, Lake of the Ozarks, Springfield and Joplin. Out of state areas covered include: Western KY (Paducah) and Southern IL (Carbondale, Makanda, Benton, Belleville, Edwardsville).

COVID-19 COMMUNITY RESPONSE FUND— MENTAL HEALTH POWERED BY YOU



Consistent with local and national trends, mental health and well-being became one of the most urgent and persistent challenges in the St. Louis Jewish community during the COVID-19 pandemic and the years following.



The following initiatives were some of Federation's response to our community's pandemic-driven mental health needs throughout 2022:

COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH TRAININGS:

- Federation worked with experts from the Blue Dove Foundation and the BBYO Center for Adolescent Wellness to conduct trainings for several cohorts, including leaders and staff from local Jewish organizations and general community members.

MENTAL HEALTH & WELL-BEING REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS:

- **12 local community organizations** received support toward their mental health and well-being proposal, totaling **\$181,000**.

Purpose of the program: To enhance the mental health and well-being of individuals within the Sabra community. **The Makom Nefesh is a space at Camp Sabra where campers can take mental health breaks.** Staff were trained to address and support campers’ mental health and well-being.

MENTAL HEALTH ACCESS FUND:

- Federation created a \$30,000 pilot fund to be used to support access to clinical mental health services. Over a six month period, **the pilot program provided reimbursement for 250+ therapy sessions and psychiatry appointments.**

DAY SCHOOL MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES:

- Federation provided funds for our local Day Schools to work to address the mental health challenges of their students in a variety of ways that fit the needs of the school community.



PRIORITIES: Israeli Civil Society and Social Welfare

Our investments helped Hand in Hand: Center for Jewish-Arab Education in Israel; Jerusalem Open House for Pride and Tolerance; and Partnership2Gether Jewish Agency for Israel create the following impact:



29,500+ individuals participated in **74 events** to celebrate, educate, and create a safe and accepting environment for LGBTQ+ individuals in Israel

480+ Arab Israeli and Jewish Israeli students attended an integrated school

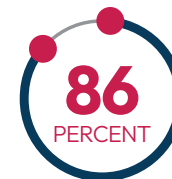


143 Early Childhood Center educators participated in professional development and training opportunities

Nine local ECC educators engaged in a Community of Practice (CoP) through Paradigm, one of the country's premier Jewish organizations for **professional development** and **advocacy in early childhood education**. They joined with around 50 educators from around the country for eight months to study and grow in areas of **"classroom best practices"**.

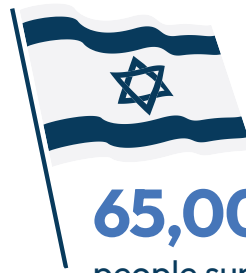

To support Ukraine, every single Federation, in all 146 communities came together and raised \$85 million — that's nearly a quarter of a million dollars per day. These dollars ensured:

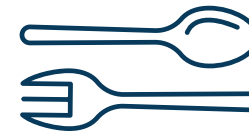

ST. LOUIS KAPLAN FELDMAN HOLOCAUST MUSEUM POWERED BY YOU



The Federation founded the St. Louis Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum in 1995 and nurtured it for over 25 years before the Museum was established as an independent museum in 2022.

The St. Louis Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum is dedicated to preserving the legacy of the Holocaust, educating about its causes and illustrating how what happened during this tragic period relates to our lives today.

In it's first 100 days, the St. Louis Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum:

- Welcomed over **4,500 total visitors**
- Engaged with **1,600 students** from around the region
- Coordinated group tours for **30 schools**
- Recruited over **700 new members**, including our Guardians of Remembrance Society
- Added nearly **80 new names** to our list of survivor names in our Survivors Gallery



Jewish Federation of St. Louis raised over **\$25 million dollars** for the Museum's expansion and endowments; an endeavor started seven years ago.

We build and maintain strong and trusting relationships with our Community Partners.



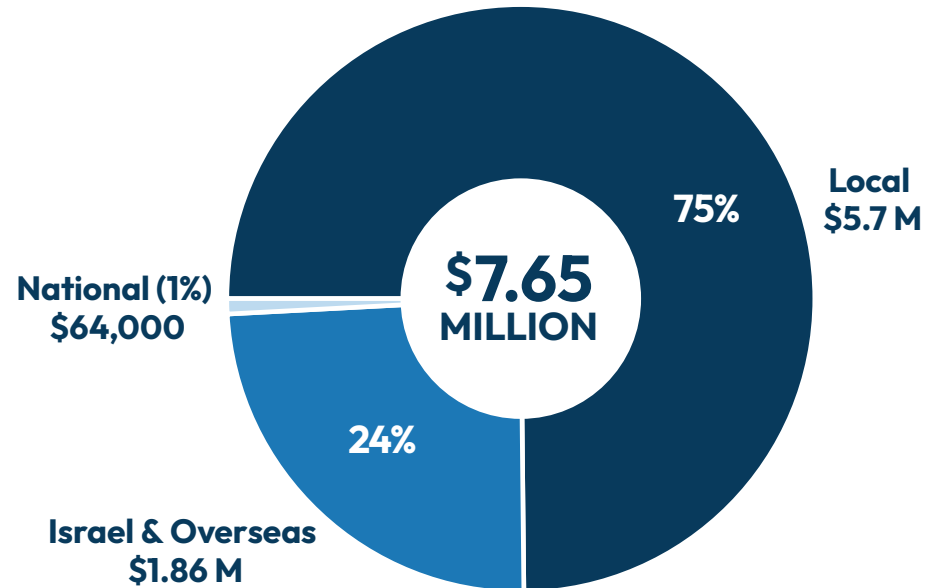
LEARNING AND IMPROVEMENT

We focus efforts around evaluation; we work with our partners to evaluate their work and aim to empower our partners to use evaluation as a tool for learning and improvement.

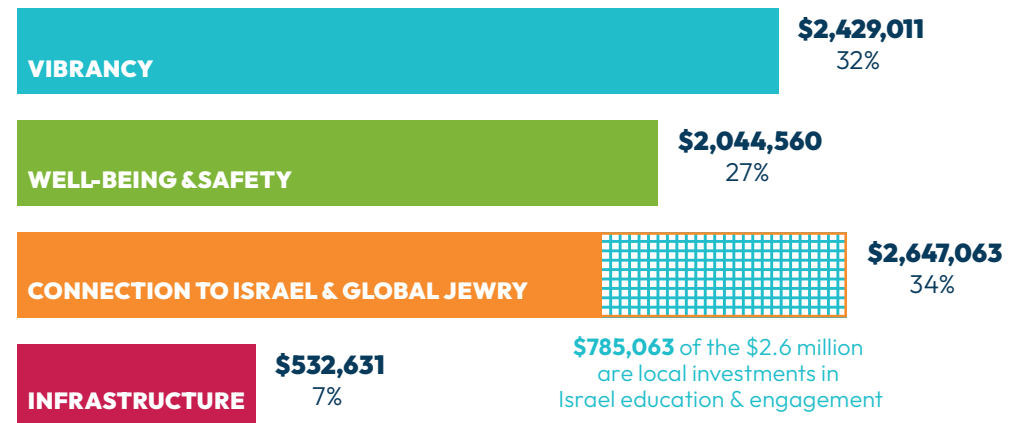


2022 COMMUNITY IMPACT INVESTMENTS
